Prayer for Our Nation

Our Father who art in Heaven, hallowed be Your name. We acknowledge that there is none like You for You are the One true living God. You are sovereign over all. Prayer for Our Church

- 1. Pray for a clear vision and guidance from God by His Spirit according to His word for our church
 - a. Psalm 25:4-5 "Show me your ways, LORD, teach me your paths. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long."
- 2. Pray for a spirit of yielding, a spirit of reconciliation, of love, unity and humility where we are not lining up with God's word; Pray for a willing spirit as we allow God to show areas of correction and be open to allow the Holy Spirit to work in us
 - a. Ephesians 2: 10 For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do
- 3. Pray for a pure heart, a heart of gold and silver taken through refiner's fire; Pray that **we would become the bride that Christ envisioned and died for**, pursuing righteousness and a blameless life amidst a broken world
- 4. Pray for unity and effectiveness in embracing Christ's mission and our great commission to make disciples; Pray that God's power be displayed by causing us at Grace and the global Church to hunger for His ways; Pray for unity that would display the love of Christ for everyone around us to see
 - a. Ephesians 3: 10-11: His intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, according to his eternal purpose, that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord
- 5. Pray that we are intentional in being aware of and caring for our neighbors
- 6. Pray for **boldness to follow Christ** in love and obedience
 - a. Eph 3: 16-19 I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, 17 so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, 18 may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, 19 and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God
